ranging a fantastic day of celebrations for Children in Need

























We've had another busy, but fun term in Sycamore class. The children have worked incredibly hard to learn new concepts in Maths, and in English they have produced some fantastic finding stories and information posters using some newly learned grammar skills. They have expressed well considered opinions during our Maafa topic and have shown good understanding about a healthy life style when learning about Food for Life.

Away from the classroom, the children very much enjoyed being part of World Book Day with great costumes and enthusiastic sharing of favourite books. The children have participated in a Children in Need assembly and wrote and delivered an assembly about diversity and respect — which they did brilliantly! Sycamore children really loved their dojo party too.









Well done to everyone who has worked hard and engaged fully in their learning. I'm looking forward to all the things we have coming up in the Summer: SATs (to show off brilliant new skills), a residential visit and a trip to Warning Zone amongst other things.

Oak Class

Oak have had a busy term. We have been learning all about different foods and where our food comes from. We have tasted lots of different fruits and talked about which we like and dislike and used lots of adjectives to describe the tastes. We have enjoyed some wonderful stories this half

term including retelling Jack and the Beanstalk and building beanstalks using lego. We have completed an investigation into finding out what a seed needs to grow by planting seeds in different conditions. A seed that had no daylight but did have water, grew well but we noticed it was white in colour!

We loved playing in the snow and exploring what happens when snow warms up. We made snowmen and snow angels and had a wonderful time.

We really enjoyed the story Handa's Surprise and made maps to show the journey Handa went on to get to Akeyo.













Maple Class

It has been another busy term for Maple Class. The children have continued with their sow and grow project. They have learnt about how plants reproduce and have taken cuttings from different plants, which we hope to plant in the school garden. In art this half term, we have explored further how artists use line, light and tone. We have used white oil pastels on black paper and have created monochrome digital images to understand aspects of form, light and shadow. In Science, we have researched the lifecycles of different species and learnt about their similarities and differences. As part of this project we carefully dissected eggs, in order to identify the key parts. We also enjoyed taking part in the World Book Day activities and Red Nose Day.









Pine Class

Pine class have had a super half term leading up to Easter. They have become football commentators in English for both Messi and Pelé and have become superheroes in our sixweek dance course. We performed this in front of Birch class, who were mighty impressed at their super hero poses! We have explored the world map in our geography lessons and focused on diversity in different cultures and religions in PHSE. We have been 'shining a light' on our science topic exploring different forms of light and shade. Lastly, we have just begun looking at the Tudors in our French topic.

Birch Class

Birch Class have had a busy Spring term. In Year 1 during English we have been writing our own fairy tale stories. We have had a focus on basic sentence punctuation, using finger spaces, capital letters and full stops. The 'Punctuation Police' do come and check everything is there! In Year 2 children have chosen their favourite fairy tale and have written their own alternative sequence to the story. They have focused on using time adverbials to order their story and synonyms to include new vocabulary.

In PE we have been developing our send and return skills using a tennis ball and a racket. We can hold the racket correctly and complete a self-serve to our partner and return the ball with some accuracy.

In our 'Rain and Sunrays' topic children have explored a range of materials found inside and outside. Children have explored different motifs linked to the weather and used a range of materials to create single and repeated prints using Collagraphy. This was very messy but lots of fun! In our 'Taxi' Topic, children were encouraged to explore mechanisms to help move objects. They found objects needed wheels and an axle attached to a chassis to move. After lots of planning and debating, children began creating their own moving object with success!
